Pupil Premium Grant Provision Statement 2018-19

The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantage pupils and those from service families close the gap between them and their peers. In 2018/19 the total Pupil Premium Grant received £171,532 Total spent £173,109

Key Priorities in 2018/19:

1. Continue to improve outcomes for all Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) students to bring attainment in line with the expected levels of progress (focus year 11 leavers 2019).

2. Continue to narrow the achievement gap of all PPG students 2018/19.

3. Narrow the attendance gap between PPG eligible students and cohort.

4. Improve engagement and behaviour for learning for PPG eligible students.

Summary of Impact (Attainment and Progress):

- The Progress of PPG students across Key Stage three has improved
- The gap between PPG students and Non-PPG has narrowed year-on-year in Ebacc subjects.
- A greater percentage of PPG students made Expected Progress or better in comparison to nondisadvantaged students in Yr9.
