- I will listen to others as I would like to be listened to.








This is Russia, what is illegal here that you might not expect?

The expectations we have of you, the student are as follows: with a positive attitude you will:

Personal presentation and preparation:

- Affend 100% of the time, arrive on time for registration and lessons, equipped with pen, penal, ruler, eraser and planner as a minimum. Bring kit, ingredients or equipment as requested.
- Wear the correct uniform, to a high standard, using appropriate language in and
- Wear only minimal make-up and maintain natural hair colours. Have no facial piercings other than ear studs. If you choose to wear nail poish, only wear one colour and keep it neatly maintained.

In lessons

- Wark where you are asked to and with whom you are asked. Se silent for the register and respond "Yes Sir" or "Yes Miss". Record homework in your planner.
- Drink only water in teaching spaces. Ensure classrooms (and the Academy at all times)
 are left tidy and litter free.
- Do not remove your mobile 'phone from your bag/pockets during lessons, ensure it is switched to leter, unless required activatives by a member of staff, if you do follow these rules, you can expect it to be confiscated for the remainder of the day to be collected by a potent/core offer 3.10pm. Do off work bedphones in lessons, put them away (and remove them at social times if a member of staff ass you to), if you do, you can expect them to be confiscated for the remainder of the day.
